My Time with God - Week 26

Congratulations!!! You have reached the half way point in reading through the New Testament!

By now your powers of observation should be pretty strong – as you notice words and themes being repeated from day to day. In Acts, there are constant references to the Holy Spirit, who is continually leading the disciples into new experiences and new relationships. All of which are life changing for the people they meet, but also dangerous for the disciples.

On Monday, in Acts 7, Stephen, full of the Holy Spirit continues to preach about Jesus, despite danger and death. Then on Tuesday, in chapter 8, Simon impressed with the power of the Holy Spirit wants to buy some of that power for himself. Simon learns God's power is not for sale, and asks Peter and John to pray for him until he grows in faith and understanding.

From Wednesday on, in chapters 9 and 10, there are three amazing stories of people who obey the Holy Spirit and do what others would consider foolish or impossible.

- Philip, in response to the Holy Spirit, strikes up a conversation with an Ethiopian and tells him all about Jesus. The Ethiopian then asks to be baptized.
- Ananias obediently lays his hands on Saul, who everyone avoided, because he was famous for killing Christians. Through Ananias, Saul is filled with the Holy Spirit and sent by God to preach about Jesus to the Gentiles.
- Peter, who had no dealings with Gentiles, is sent by the Holy Spirit to Cornelius, as God reveals to him that for God every person is the same.

As you hear these stories of how the disciples formed the early church by following the Holy Spirit how do you think the Holy Spirit is leading our church?

Working to send 15 people to Kenya has been, and continues to be, a learning experience. There have been many rewarding moments and many challenging ones as well. One of the most daunting elements of planning this trip has been the \$45,000.00 proposed budget. Many people thought we were nuts to even attempt at trip costing this amount of money. To prove them right, we then committed to raising half of the funds, \$22,500 through fund raising efforts. To date, we not only reached that goal, but surpassed it as well. We would like to show everyone how we did this and how the rest of the budget is being covered.
