Changes to Worship

The Worship Committee is reviewing all the elements of our current worship service with Pastor Roberta. We are examining each element of worship as to the purpose of each element of worship, either in what it tells us about God, or how it helps us express our faith; what is being expressed by where the element is located in our order of worship; and how a particular element might be repositioned or changed to enhance our worship experience. We envision that various changes will be made over time. As revisions are introduced, they will be presented to the congregation and the rationale will be explained both in the weekly bulletin and the Flyer. The following initial changes were introduced June 21:

The Doxology (*Praise God From Whom All Blessings Flow*) the Gloria Patri (*Glory Be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Ghost*) as well as the Apostles' Creed all help express our worship of God as Trinity. We will no longer sing the Doxology following the Song for Assembly, and instead either sing the Doxology or Gloria Patri following the Assurance of Pardon.

We will now include the Lord's Prayer with the Prayers of the People, rather than after the Prayer of Adoration.

Become A Prayer Partner – Sponsor A Workcamper

Seventeen years ago, Jim and Deanne Robinson's daughter attended a workcamp with another church. When she returned to Faith, she gave a minute for mission and inspired a congregational member. Harvey Trop was so excited that he thought our church should do one also. He went to the mission committee for approval and guidance and in 1992- 2 adults and 6 youth attended camp in Logan, WV. Since then over 90 different people have attended and many have attended multiple camps over the years. This mission trip gives us an opportunity to serve God by helping others. We work on homes for the elderly and impaired free of cost to them. From Faith Church alone more than 400 homes have been repaired which equates to over 13,000 "on site" hours of

community service. We also receive God's blessing of spiritual growth. There are devotions held each day at our worksites and evening programs consisting of contemporary Christian music, Bible readings, skits, and lessons and then evening devotions with our own youth groups. We make new friends. We are broken up into work groups with others from churches around the country and many participants have kept in touch for years. Faith Church bonded with a group from Brownsville NJ and we have attended each others' worship services for the past 2 years.

This year 4 adults and 17 youth will be attending workcamp. The location is still unknown because our number of youth was higher than anticipated and our main focus is trying to get everyone to go. We'll keep you posted on the place because we know the campers are dying to know which museum we will be visiting.

As part of our spiritual growth at camp, and one way the congregation can share our experience is to become a *prayer partner* with a camper. For a pledge of \$75 (or whatever your heart compels you to give) you will both receive matching dog tags. We wear our tags all week and pray for our partners. You will also receive a devotional guide that is written by our group which we use for our evening devotions. We do receive a devotion guide from the camp and we use them as well but feel it is important to have a connection to our partners back home.

What is Equal Exchange?

Equal Exchange was founded in 1986 to create a new approach to trade, one that includes informed consumers, honest and fair trade relationships and cooperative principles. As a worker-owned co-op, they accomplish this by offering consumers fairly

traded gourmet coffee direct from small-scale farmer co-ops in Latin America, Africa and Asia.

Equal Exchange's Commitment

- To offer consumers the finest in gourmet, certified organic and shade-grown coffees.
- To always pay a fair price to the farmer, including a guaranteed minimum when market prices are low, and above market premiums for quality and certified organic coffee.
- To work directly with democratically run farming cooperatives—businesses that are owned and governed by and for the farmers—so that the benefits of trade actually reach the farmers and their communities.
- To provide vital advance credit to farmers, which is normally unavailable or offered at prohibitive rates. Credit provides income between harvests and helps farmers to stay out of debt.
- To encourage ecologically sustainable farming practices that help build a long-term economic base for farmers while promoting community health and protecting the environment.
- To develop long-term trade relations based on trust and respect.
