## **THE WORD OF GOD**

### A WORD WITH THE CHILDREN

#### FIRST LESSON

2 KINGS 22:1A, 2, 8, 10-13; 23:1-3

OT – Pg. 360 in the gray Bible, Pg. 339 in the blue Bible

22 Josiah was eight years old when he began to reign; he reigned for thirty-one years in Jerusalem. <sup>2</sup>He did what was right in the sight of the LORD, and walked in all the way of his father David; he did not turn aside to the right or to the left.

8 The high priest Hilkiyah said to Shaphan the secretary, 'I have found the book of the law in the house of the LORD.' When Hilkiyah gave the book to Shaphan, he read it.

<sup>10</sup>Shaphan the secretary informed the king, 'The priest Hilkiyah has given me a book.' Shaphan then read it aloud to the king.

11 When the king heard the words of the book of the law, he tore his clothes. <sup>12</sup>Then the king commanded the priest Hilkiyah, Ahikam son of Shaphan, Achbor son of Micaiah, Shaphan the secretary, and the king's servant Asaiah, saying, <sup>13</sup>'Go, inquire of the LORD for me, for the people, and for all Judah, concerning the words of this book that has been found; for great is the wrath of the LORD that is kindled against us, because our ancestors did not obey the words of this book, to do according to all that is written concerning us.'

23 Then the king directed that all the elders of Judah and Jerusalem should be gathered to him. <sup>2</sup>The king went up to the house of the LORD, and with him went all the people of Judah, all the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the priests, the prophets, and all the people, both small and great; he read in their hearing all the words of the book of the covenant that had been found in the house of the LORD. <sup>3</sup>The king stood by the pillar and made a covenant before the LORD, to follow the LORD, keeping his commandments, his decrees, and his statutes, with all his heart and all his soul, to perform the words of this covenant that were written in this book. All the people joined in the covenant.
