Peacemaking

The Peacemaking Offering was created in 1980 to support the efforts of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) to live out a deeper commitment to peacemaking as part of our faithfulness to God. Most churches receive the Offering on World Communion Sunday, the first Sunday in October, which this year is October 4. As is our tradition, Faith Church will receive and dedicate its offering on World Communion Sunday.

Each congregation is encouraged to retain 25% of the Offering it receives to use for local ministries of peacemaking within the church and its community. 25% is used by presbyteries and synods, and 50% is used by the General Assembly ministries through the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program. **Faith Church will donate it's 25% to CROP Walk this year.**
