INVITATION TO THE LORD'S TABLE

Leader: Friends, this is the joyful feast of the people of God.

People: We come to the table so that we might be in communion with our God and Savior, receiving His grace and being restored. We come to the table so that we might be in communion with each other, setting down all that divides us and bearing each other's burdens.

Leader: This is the LORD's table. Christ sits at the head, and disciples of every place and every time are seated joyfully in His presence.

People: We come to joyfully eat and drink together at the table of our Savior.

Leader: On the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and when he had given God thanks and praise, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying "Take, eat, this is my body given for you."

In the same way, when the supper had ended, he took the cup, and again gave God thanks and praise, saying, "This is the cup of the new covenant, sealed in my blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sin. Whenever you drink it, do this, remembering me."

(It is the custom of Faith Church to hold the Bread and Cup until everyone is served so that all might feast together. When all have received the Bread the pastor will invite us to eat of the bread of life. When all have received the Cup the pastor will invite us to drink of the cup of salvation.)

Leader: As Christ's disciples gathered around his table, we pray together the prayer He has taught us saying,

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day, our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory forever. Amen.

Leader: We have been forgiven, loved and freed by Jesus Christ. On the evening of the first Easter day when the disciples were together, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you, my peace I leave with you." As the body gathered in true communion, let us stand now and offer to one another the Peace of Christ.

Souper Bowl of Caring

It has been 23 years since the youth of Spring Valley Presbyterian Church in Columbia, SC addressed the issue of hunger in their community with this Super Bowl Sunday prayer:

“Lord, as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us to be mindful of those without even a bowl of soup to eat.”

The prayer inspired a single church to invite 21 other congregations to join with them in collecting \$5,700, which was donated to local charities that provide assistance to those in need.

Over the past 23 years, more than \$50 million has been raised in cash and food for organizations that fight hunger. From a simple prayer and a single youth group, the Souper Bowl of Caring has become a powerful nationwide movement that touches more lives each year.
